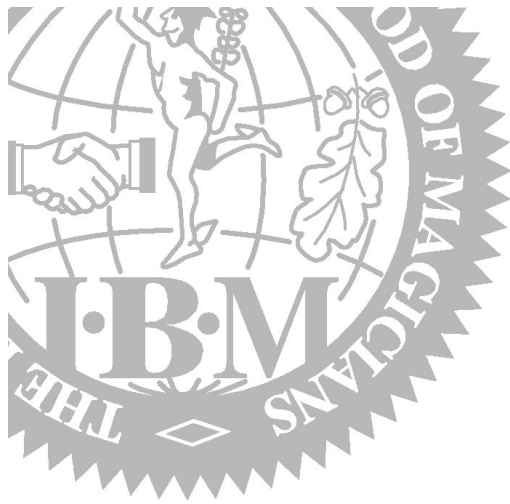

Review on S.C.A.M. 2001

Saturday featured . . .

CHARLES PECOR did a fine lecture, followed by a wonderful, little one-act play called "A LEAK IN THE UNIVERSE". The basic premise of which was that two scientists were discussing a small box in which everything placed within it ... DISAPPEARED, thereby proving a "leak in the universe"! Featuring JOHN TUDOR and KEVIN DUNN, I found it mesmerizing.

The CLOSE-UP SHOW followed and featured such luminaries as CHAD LONG, WOODY LANDERS, LEE ASHER, KEVIN DUNN, and JAY SANKEY. It was a great show made so by the divergent styles of the various performers. CHAD LONG and JAY SANKEY followed with lectures. Since both individuals are close-up geniuses and certifiably INSANE, you know that both lectures were delightful.

Billed as an "alternate" lecture, REBEQUE TUDOR gave a lecture on costuming and make-up for magicians and assistants. It was excellent and should have been REQUIRED ATTENDANCE for any performer.

Finally, on Saturday Night we had the GALA REVUE SHOW. The show featured pre-show close-up which I never did find, and performances by M.C. MARK MERCHANT (wonderful! "...I'm so straight, I eat a banana with a knife and fork!"), MR. ELECTRIC & CAROL (Standing Ovation!! Electricity on the stage and IN the performers!), ED DUNHILL (Old Style, supposedly cowboy act, but other than wearing a cowboy hat, I didn't get it... several of his items, I got the impression he had bought them THAT DAY in the dealers room), THE FETTUCINI BROTHERS (Tremendous byplay, dialogue and juggling!), KEVIN DUNN (who sang a song and scooted about the stage while holding his cape out to his sides, much like you would expect from an eight-year-old... finally, managing to "levitate" himself under-cover of the cape. I thought it was a long way to go for a lousy effect. HOWEVER... I *do* appreciate his originality and uniqueness in an otherwise bland magical arena), and AARON RADATZ AND COMPANY MAGIC SHOW to close out the evening. They did a bang-up job throughout their act. Their act concluded with an illusion which featured a switch between Aaron and his assistant. The effect was somewhat convoluted and actually diminished the overall punch of his show.

Last, but not least, the S.C.A.M. folks hosted a wonderful reception for ALL ATTENDEES at a small theater where folks could gather, snack, talk, and generally kibitz with each other. It was VERY NICE and I thank S.C.A.M. for closing the convention in such a friendly fashion!
